Please complete **at least one** activity from each of the four categories.

LOCAL LORE AND LEGENDS

- Explore a native culture – visit a reservation or invite a speaker to share their legends and lore as Jacob does with Bella.
- What extra abilities do some of the vampires possess? Make a list and pick a few to research (i.e., telepathy, psychic powers). Are any of these real or are they just made up? What special talents and skills do you possess that could be developed?
- Find out about vampire, werewolf, and other supernatural myths and legends. Where did they originate and how do they differ? Compare and map out what you find.

SERVICE PROJECT

- Organize a blood drive in your local community! Find out your blood type and, if you are old enough, consider donating.
- Host a book club to chat about the series. Make a list of questions for discussion and invite an adult expert, like your school counselor, to a meeting to talk about issues facing teens, such as bullying, body image, eating disorders, sex, teen pregnancy, and relationships.
- Why does Bella hate to celebrate her birthday? Make birthday boxes filled with party hats, cake mix, supplies and a small gift. Donate it to a shelter or food pantry for someone who does want a party, but might not get one.

TOO COOL FOR SCHOOL – TAKE A CLASS AND LEARN SOMETHING NEW!

- What kind of cars do the Cullen's drive? And Bella? Contact a mechanic and learn basic auto repairs and car maintenance.
- Bella does most of the cooking at home because Charlie burns spaghetti! Take a cooking class or learn some new recipes and prepare a meal together.
- It's a good thing the Cullen's have a doctor in the family! Take a first aid/CPR class to learn the basics.

TIME TO PUT THE BOOKS DOWN AND GET MOVIN'

- Edward is so protective of Bella – he even saves her from a gang in Port Angeles. Take a self defense class and learn some ways to protect yourself!
- Alice is a party planner extraordinaire! Plan and host a party or dance and invite family members or a younger troop to join in the fun.
