SILVER AWARD ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES



There are lots of different people who participate in and contribute to the Silver Award Program in various ways. Here are some suggestions of the roles that different folks might be responsible for along the way. Keep in mind, Silver Awards are *girl led*! As a project manager, each Silver Award Candidate brings her own unique skills and aspirations to the Silver Award. Take a look at these guidelines and then make choices that are right for you! Remember girls must take Going for the Silver training before submitting a project proposal.
