

A well-stocked first aid kit is a handy thing to have.

To be prepared for emergencies, have a troop first aid kit with you any time girls are present. With the girls, check it before each adventure!

First aid kits come in many shapes and sizes. You can purchase one or make your own. Whether you buy a first aid kit or put one together, make sure it has all the items you may need and check the kit regularly:

- ☐ Include any personal items such as medications, Health History, permission forms, and emergency phone numbers
- \Box 4 absorbent compress dressings (5 x 9 inches) (Sanitary napkins are inexpensive sterile compresses)
- □ 25 adhesive bandages (assorted sizes)

25 aunesive bandages (assorted size
1 adhesive cloth tape (10 yards x 1 inch)
10 antibiotic ointment packets (approximately 1 gram)
10 antiseptic wipe packets
Hand sanitizer
Acetaminophen or ibuprofen (check dates)
Antihistamine (check dates)

- □ 2 packets of aspirin (81 mg each)—These are for adult cardiac emergency, **not to be given to girls**
- ☐ 2 instant cold compresses
- ☐ Blister treatment
- ☐ 4 hydrocortisone ointment packets (approximately 1 gram each)
- □ 1 3-in. gauze or elastoplast roll (roller) bandage
- □ 1 ACE bandage (4 inches wide)
- ☐ 10 sterile gauze pads (4 x 4 inches) or sanitary napkins
- ☐ Oral thermometer (non-mercury/non-glass)
- □ 2 triangular bandages or oversized bandanas
- □ 2 pair of vinyl or nitrile (NOT latex) gloves (size: large)
- □ 2 emergency blankets
- □ 1 breathing barrier (with one-way valve)
- □ Face masks
- □ Tweezers
- □ Nail Clippers
- □ Round-tip scissors
- □ Safety pins
- ☐ Water purification tablets
- ☐ Honey or sugar packets
- ☐ Emergency First Aid guide
