- 7. Be considerate of other visitors



We knew we wanted to learn more about gems and minerals, so after doing some research on the Sluice at Bethel Outdoor Adventure & Campground (https://betheloutdooradventure.com/), we came across Bethel!

Where do we want to go?

- Visit the Sluice, hunt and learn more about gems and minerals
- Try out the Burma Bridge

What we want to learn/ask while there:

(What global/cultural connections can you find? What unique features may you find in this area? What can you identify that's unique to this state? What historical information can you find on this area?)

We learned that on June 10, 1796, Sudbury-Canada Plantation was incorporated as Bethel, the name taken from the Book of Genesis and meaning "House of God."

It was cool to discover that Bethel was one of the best farming towns in the state, especially for hay and potatoes. In winter, farmers found work logging, with the lumber cut at sawmills operated by water power from streams. Other manufacturers produced flour, leather and harnesses, furniture, boots and shoes, carriages, and marble and granite work. We learned that Bethel is located in Oxford county, which actually has a long history of mineral and gemstones too – which is one of the things we were really excited to learn about!

Are there other places we can visit while there?

(For example, is there a tourist information that recommends other things to do or that a local may have suggested during your visit?)

We also visited the Maine Mineral and Gem Museum, 99 Main Street, Bethel, ME 04217 to learn more about gems and minerals. It has a cool blasting exhibit too!

What will we need?

(Hiking shoes, snacks, water, map of the area, camera, etc).
