How can GSME Girl Scouts celebrate?

As Service Units and Troops, celebrate Girls in ICT Day with activities focused on ICT and women in ICT. Whether at a Service Unit event or in your own troop, talk about why it is important for women to be in ICT careers, to celebrate the achievements of women in the ICT career field, and how they use technology every day.

Activities for Girls in ICT Day

The theme for Girls in ICT Day remains the same each year: 'To introduce our future generations to the careers in Information and Communication Technologies'. Here are some suggested activities.

- Visit a local company and discuss how they use technology in their everyday work. This company does not have to be a technology company; consider the local fire department, library, bakery, bank and so on.
- Ask a woman who is in an ICT career field come to your meeting and speak to the girls.
- Is there a local computer club or computer classes, maybe at the local high school or college? Ask if some of the female students would come to your meeting and do activities with the girls and at the same time discuss being females in classes/club.
