Cade	tte	<ul> <li>Silver Torch Award: This award recognizes Cadettes who act as leaders in their communities. Do these steps to earn the award:</li> <li>1. Complete one Cadette Journey</li> <li>2. Serve for one full term in a leadership position at your school, place of worship, library, town council, community center, after school club or a similar organization.</li> </ul>
		<ol> <li>Leader in Action (LiA): These awards recognize Cadettes who act as mentors to Brownies. Do these steps to earn the awards:         <ol> <li>Connect with a Troop Leader / Adult Volunteer guiding a Brownie Troop in your Girl Scout community.</li> </ol> </li> <li>Share your organizational skills and use your special talents to teach Brownies something important as you assist them through earning a Brownie Journey.</li> </ol>
	PA	Program Aide (PA): This award recognizes Cadettes who act as mentors to younger girls over six activity sessions. Do these steps to earn this award:  1. Earn one LiA Award (see above). 2. Complete the GSME Program Aide Training. 3. Work directly with younger girls over six activity sessions.

Complete one Senior Journey</li> <li>2. Serve for one full term in a leadership position at your school, place of worship, library, town council, community center,</li> </ul>



**Counselor in Training (CIT) 1:** This award recognizes girls who mentor younger girls in a camp setting. Do these steps to earn this award:

after school club or a similar organization.


- 1. Be at least 15 years of age
- 2. Complete the three week CIT 1 program at Camp Natarswi or the four week program at Camp Pondicherry.



**Volunteer in Training (VIT):** This award recognizes girls who mentor Daisies, Brownies, Juniors, or Cadette Girl Scouts. Do these steps to earn the award:

- 1. Find an adult volunteer mentor who works with the age level of girls you want to work with.
- 2. Complete the GSME Intent Form
- 3. Complete the GSME Trainings Troop Volunteers parts 1 & 2
- 4. Create and implement a Journey project with the girls you're mentoring that lasts 4 or more troop sessions.
- 5. Complete and submit the Volunteer in Training Final Report and log of hours.





- 1. Complete one Ambassador Journey
- 2. Serve for one full term in a leadership position at your school, place of worship, library, town council, community center, after school club or a similar organization.

**Counselor in Training (CIT):** This award recognizes girls who mentor younger girls in a camp setting. Do these steps to earn this award:

- 1. Be at least 15 years of age
- 2. Complete the three week CIT 1 program at Camp Natarswi or the four week program at Camp Pondicherry.




- 1. Have successfully completed the CIT 1 program at Camp Natarswi or Camp Pondicherry
- 2. Be at least 17 years of age
- 3. Complete the four week CIT 2 program at Camp Natarswi or Camp Pondicherry.



**Volunteer in Training (VIT):** This award recognizes girls who mentor Daisies, Brownies, Juniors or Cadette Girl Scouts. Do these steps to earn the award:


- 1. Find an adult volunteer mentor who works with the age level of girls you want to work with.
- 2. Complete the GSME Intent Form
- 3. Complete the GSME Training Course Troop Volunteers parts 1 & 2
- 4. Create and implement a Journey project with the girls you're mentoring that lasts 4 or more troop sessions.





**Community Service Bars:** These awards recognize girls who make a difference in their community by practicing the values of the Girl Scout Law, and getting involved with a cause they care about. Do these steps to earn the award:

- 1. Choose an organization you'd like to volunteer with. The organization will need to agree to give you instructions about the work you'll be doing.
- 2. Volunteer a minimum of 20 hours.
- 3. Complete a service hour log and submit it to your Troop Leader or Adult Volunteer for approval.



**Service to Girl Scouting Bars:** These awards recognize girls who have volunteered 20 or more hours to the Girl Scout organization. Examples of volunteer work include: volunteering at a Girl Scout program or event or assisting your Service Unit with special projects and events. Do these steps to earn the award:

- 1. Research upcoming GSME program and events and reach out council about volunteering at a few.
- 2. Same with the SU
- 3. Complete a service hour log and submit it to your Troop Leader or Adult Volunteer for approval.

Reminder: All of these are awards and should be worn on the front of your uniform!
